
I am writing to enlist your membership in the Interparliamentary Human Rights Network of the Congressional Human Rights Foundation.



Thank you so much for your fax of June 6, together with the forms for the other parliamentarians. On behalf of IPN members in 60 countries, I welcome your participation in our efforts.

I hope you will keep me informed of the situation in Sanjak. As you know, we are able to communicate your concerns to interested parliamentarians worldwide, primarily through the IPN Network Update, which I am sending by mail. You will note that we did mention your difficulties with the Serbian police in last month's issue.

I want to let you know of two forthcoming meetings which may be of interest. In Paris June 24, Jean-Marie Daillet, a French parliamentarian and IPN member, will be hosting a conference on Yugoslavia; I understand he has all the Presidents of the former republics participating.

The other meeting is a Regional IPN Meeting to take place in Ljubljana next January 15-17. I will be sending you details of this event in the coming weeks. I hope to have parliamentarians from about 15 countries involved.
